

Vaginal Birth After a Previous Cesarean Section



Vaginal birth. is an option for most women who have had a previous caesarean, but it's crucial to seek medical advice to determine the safest option

Medically unnecessary caesarean sections are associated with a higher risk of maternal mortality during the perinatal period compared to vaginal deliveries



Three out of four women who died during childbirth had cesarean deliveries
